Many village groups were represented at the Annual Parish Assembly Meeting on Monday 22nd showing once again what a wealth of activities we have in Blisworth! The attendance was higher than last year when a different format was introduced allowing groups to showcase their achievements. The displays were extremely well thought out and demonstrated a great deal of work by the volunteers.

Proposed designs for a Village Sign were on show and the most popular was by Ivan Chester. Suggestions for a site strongly favour 'Elm Tree Corner'. We now need quotes and planning permission, what a wonderful conclusion to our 'Best Village' year if the sign could be installed before the Canal Festival! Well done to the local artists for producing designs and showing again what talent there is in the village.

Helen Howard from Highways gave an insight into the question of '*When is a pothole not a pothole*' and the pro's and con's of double yellow lines. The problem of inconsiderate parking outside the Doctors Surgery is longstanding and will generate further debate. Yellow lines from the school to Windmill Avenue are possibly not so controversial and these may be put in later this year. We will have to see how effective they are!

There was some very positive feedback from the evening and we will build on this for next year. The excellent response from organisations resulted in a packed room so we may need to limit space and possibly set a word limit for the reports (copies of these are available on www.blisworthparishcouncil.org.uk).

Holding the event on a Monday presents difficulties for some groups so we could consider a different day but with such an active village nearly every evening has something happening! A huge thank you to all those who gave their time before, during and after to make the Annual Parish Meeting such a success. It will be even better next year!

'Best Village' Signs

SNC are providing 5 signs "Northamptonshire Best Village 2012" for all entry points to the village. When the design is finalised we look forward to their delivery within 3 weeks.

Northamptonshire Churchyard Conservation Award Following our success in this competition last year an the award of a certificate for our churchyards being hospitable to wildlife, we have now sent in our application for 2013. All 105 saplings given to us by the Woodland Trust have now been planted, in the Churchyard, the Old Graveyard a small copse on the playing field. Our thanks to Colin Wakelin who allowed them to overwinter on his farm and Colin Gardner and members of the Blisworth Gardening Group who assisted in the chilly task of planting them.

One of the requirements for the churchyard award is to monitor and record wildlife and we are grateful to Tina and Colin Adams for their help. Plans are progressing for an information board to be erected in the Old Graveyard with lists of wildlife, plus the history and the management plan of the area. A plan of the graves and names will also be displayed in the church porch.

Soldiers Award

After six months training at Catterick Rifleman Craig Bryan won a top army award which was presented at his passing out parade. Craig was voted 'Soldier's Soldier' by his fellow Riflemen. Following the Wildlife in Churchyards Award given last year for our churchyards being hospitable to wildlife, we are pleased to note the abundance of snowdrops following last year's division of bulbs "in the green". Jubilee tree saplings given by the Woodland Trust have been overwintered on Colin Wakelin's farm, with some transplanted into our churchyards to form (eventually) hedgerows of hawthorn, blackthorn and hazel. The remainder of the saplings will be planted in a suitable site near the football field.
