Notes from the Chairman......

Exciting things are happening in the village in the next few months! The Canal Festival with a vast range of entertainment and venues promises to be bigger and better than ever!! The Village Sign chosen at the Parish Meeting is underway and although not likely to be in place at Elm Tree Corner we are hoping it will be on show at the festival.

South Northants are contributing signs celebrating our success as Best Village 2012 on or near the 5 main roads into the village. These are of a distinctive heritage design and will be a permanent statement of our achievement.

The Wildlife Conservation Silver Award for the old churchyard (cemetery) is another great achievement! It will be displayed on the stunning new information board which is nearing completion. When the formalities of permission from the diocese and planning are completed the board should be put in place. It is a sensitive design and will complement the churchyard which has been a controversial subject in the village for some time. Hopefully this will reassure everyone that it is a special place for all to enjoy and look after.

Special thanks to Carolyn and David Young for replenishing the planters on the main road and to the volunteers who maintain them. They are a lovely welcome to the village. Grateful thanks also to those who continue to litter pick, it can be a thankless task when there are so many thoughtless people who don't care about our village or the environment.

Unfortunately some *not so good* happenings have been reported during recent weeks. While leaving the Royal Oak with her fish and chips a lady was knocked over by a youth on a bicycle and suffered some nasty injuries. As the main road is so busy with speeding cars I can understand cycling on the pavement for safety **but** cyclists **must** ride at a sensible, appropriate speed with care and consideration for pedestrians who, after all have right of way on the footpath.

An odd occurrence – and possibly not that important to some – is the disappearance of the 5 mile marker on the footpath halfway up the hill into the village. I believe it was put there by George Freeston and marked the equal distance between Towcester and Northampton. It was taken around about 10th June, if anyone has any information we would be pleased to hear from you.

Finally an event that went unmentioned was the milestone for Dave Dalton at the Parish Council meeting in May. This marked Dave's 25th year as a Parish Councillor!! There are possibly others who have served the village and this may be an appropriate time to say **well done!** And **thank you!** for all your efforts and from me personally for all your support.

Courteenhall Road Allotment Site

During June and July work on the allotment slows down and there is time to enjoy the fruits of your labour. Although spring was very late this year and vegetables are still not as far advanced as they should be, you can expect to harvest early potatoes, broad beans and young carrots.

Carrots are invariably affected by carrot root fly; the best way to beat this pest is to grow them under environmesh. Try to sow sparingly so that you do not have to thin the young plants and don't weed on a windy day.

At the time of writing this article, a very good, newly cleared plot has become available. If you think you would like to take on an allotment, please contact me, **Jane Hill**, on **858656** and I shall be very pleased to show you around. The site is very friendly and the soil is light, making it easy to work. Plot holders grow all sorts of vegetables with great success.

Following the recent success of the Art Show where 54 local artists exhibited 154 art works, Members elected to share the proceeds between 4 village organisations that benefit the Community.


Grateful thanks to Village ladies who baked cakes and all the Group Members who helped in many ways to produce a vibrant exhibition that attracted over 200 visitors.
