Notes from the Chairman......

Planning: Howden's

The good news is that Howden's have pulled out of the Planning application, however Roxhill "The Developers" probably still have an option on the land therefore we may yet see another application submitted for the site. Despite Howden's decision we decided to continue with the walk on Sunday 7th June and about 40 people from Blisworth joined around another 120 from Milton, Collingtree and Roade to view the potential site and to get an idea of the scale of the area in case a different scheme is submitted.

Willow House

In view of the two confidential meetings concerning the above proposal that your PC had been requested to attend with Robert Fallon "SNC Development Services Manager" the PC felt that some transparency was needed. Therefore it was decided to allow SNC to give a short presentation of the outline planning application to allow public viewing of the proposal prior to the May PC meeting.

We have received some comments that the presentation was not publicized enough and not enough time allowed. That was not the PC's aim "if the developers want a full public consultation it is up to them to arrange it". The PC had always been informed that all planning discussions should be held in the public domain. Therefore we had felt we were in a very difficult position and wanted the plans we had seen to be viewed by interested parties as soon as possible.

Red Wheel Presentation



SAVE BLISWORTH'S HEDGEHOGS

There could be no hedgehogs left in ten years time! Can we do anything to prevent this? YES

- 1. Make a hole in your fence so that hedgehogs can roam between gardens
- 2. Plant a hedge instead of a fence
- 3. Make sure a hedgehog can climb out of your pond
- 4. Create a wild corner in your garden.
- 5. Check long grass for hedgehogs before cutting.
- 6. Keep drains covered
- 7. Check compost heaps for hedgehogs before digging
- 8. Create a woodpile for them to hide in
- Provide food such as meat-based cat or dog food, chopped apples or unsalted peanut sand meal worms. Also provide a dish of water and ensure food is removed before it attracts rats.
