

Notes from the Chairman......

Planning

With the exception of the proposed Solar Farm on Knock Lane, we only have minor house extension applications, nothing too contentious. If the Solar Farm goes ahead there could be some financial benefits to the village, your PC is looking to see what we can obtain on the village's behalf.

Conservation Area

SNC are to revise the boundary of the village's conservation area, the provisional plan was discussed at the PC meeting in August. The majority of changes were small such as the original boundary went through the middle of the school!. This is changed to include the whole school and playgrounds. The area around the Canal including, the Old Mill, Grafton House and the Sun Moon and Stars is to be listed under "The Grand Union Canal Conservation Area". The other change was the removal of the land owned by the Old Rectory, the owners, Mr & Mrs Hawkins wished it to remain in the conservation area, your PC supported them and Councillor Kennedy organized a petition to send to SNC. They have now revised the boundary to retain the Old Rectory's land.

Stoke Road

We are still trying to obtain some safety improvements for pedestrians between the Allotments and the Canal Tunnel entrance. To this end Councillors Gardiner and Rose had another meeting with Highways about either white lines to mark the edge of the road "this was turned down due to the road being too narrow!" or moving the 30mph sign to before the Tunnel entrance. This suggestion was turned down some time ago, however your PC have now decided to appeal against this decision, let's hope we have more luck this time.

Canal Festival

Another excellent weekend organized by the Blisworth Canal Partnership, I believe that the attendance was the best ever, well done and thank you to all those involved. More details elsewhere in the R&A.

Parish Plan Progress Team Report

As you may be aware Blisworth won a Highly Commended Certificate in the 2015 Best Village Competition. The Certificate is on display in the Cabinet in the Village Hall. Once we have the judges' comments we will look into what needs improvement before entering again.

We have a response from Peterborough Diocese about our plan to install a fence as a boundary in the Old Cemetery where the dry stone wall has collapsed. Unfortunately the Diocese do not in agree with our proposals and want the wall reinstated. We intend to investigate the cost of doing so and may need to apply for a grant if the cost is prohibitive.

We continue to receive favourable comments on the gates and the improved entrance to the Old Cemetery.'
