Notes from the Chairman......

Planning

The Solar Farm

The proposed Solar Farm on Knock Lane was supported by your Parish Council, however it has been turned down by SNC! This was a great disappointment to us, as well as supporting environmentally friendly energy we had obtained from the developer a £50,000 benefit to the village. This money would have been split between the school and various organizations in the village. However all is not yet lost as the developers may appeal. We will keep you informed!

Willow House

The planning application for a five house development adjacent to the canal came before your PC in October. There had already been considerable discussion about the scheme. We recommended rejection, the main reasons being: we felt that 5 houses would overcrowd the site, we already have considerable development agreed or being implemented in the village and that we should support all the neighbours and the Canal Partnership who opposed the scheme.

The Chapel Hill Development

At the time of writing your PC has just been informed that Orbit intend to apply for a section 73 to amend the planning conditions as follows. To reduce the number of affordable houses from 11 to 5, to alter the specification and build some houses in brick not stone and finally to have condition 17 "That no construction traffic should use Chapel Lane for access" removed. Your PC intend to have an open meeting with Orbit at 7.30pm on Monday 26th October to discuss these changes, again we will keep you informed.

Stoke Road

At last your PC has some success improving road safety up to the Tunnel car park. After appealing against the highways decision we had an on-site meeting with Helen Howard "Highways Officer" at a peak traffic time. We managed to get the 30mph signs moved out to just past the car park.

Winter is Coming

Your PC will again be providing Salt bins on Church Lane, the Wellspring/Windmill corner and on the footpath between Westbrook and Little Lane, these bins are supplied and filled by your PC, for your safety. However if you are aware of any other dangerous spots in icy weather please let a member of the Parish Council know and we will endeayour to help.
