Notes from the Chairman......

Parish Council Vacancy

Unfortunately there hasn't been any applications for the vacancy, therefore at our 4th July PC Meeting we will look to co-opt a suitable person to join us, there is still time if you think you would like to help shape your village, please contact our clerk Viv Hartley or myself for more details.

Planning

Rail Central

Following the public presentations, which your Parish Council felt failed to give us any more information on the proposal than we already had, specifically on the capacity of British Rail to service the site, the size of buildings and the projected traffic flows, the general consensus was that Ashfield Land are going through the motions rather than giving us hard facts to work on!

Sun Moon and Stars development

You PC will be attending the development meeting to emphasize the potential parking problems if an extra house is built on the existing car parking area.

Connegar Leys development

We are in conversation with the planning officer over the South Northants Homes proposal to build on the old garage site in Connegar Leys and are trying to obtain the construction of some hard surfaced parking spaces on the grassed area opposite the site entrance.

Candle Cottage

The developer has again submitted an application to build up to five houses on the site, with just a slight amendment to the original application, as before your PC is objecting to the scheme stating the same reasons for refusal: outside the village envelope, site access to close too the canal bridge etc.

De-Fribulator

I am pleased to inform you that the de-fribulator with cabinet has now been purchased by your PC and we hope to have it installed at the school before the summer holidays. The ambulance service will be running a course on how to operate this machine and I would urge as many as possible to attend. Details and times of the course will be put in the shop, pub and on the village notice boards.

In an attempt to reduce speeding in our village we have agreed to purchase a portable VAS sign that it may be moved around the village, it will be battery operated and can be clamped to any suitable post or lamp standard.
