#### **Chapel Lane**

The SNC planning committee considered the application on Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> October following concerns about site access via the steep and narrow Little Lane and Chapel Lane. The planning committee decided they needed further information and another site inspection so the decision was deferred. Councillor Steve Clarke, Blisworth PC representative June Hawkins and Tricia White parishioner made representations to the meeting. #### **Sun Moon and Stars**

SNC finally approved a planning application to renovate the SMS but with the addition of a detached house in the grounds and no provision for adequate onsite parking (both matters about which the Parish Council objected). It remains to be seen if this now results in a contract to carry out the work.

#### **Stop Rail Central**

I should like to thank all the people who attended the public meeting, 89% objected to the plans. The first phase of the consultation is now finished.

I would also like to thank Mark Redding and his team for all of the dedicated work they do on behalf of Blisworth .The village should be proud to be represented by this team and should continue to assist them in any way that they can by giving their help and support, as Stop Rail Central moves on to challenge the next phase of the Campaign.
