Litter Campaign

Following donations from various village organisations, the Group have purchased 8 new litter bins. Some are already in place, opposite the Walnut Tree in Station Road, Candlebridge in Chapel Lane on the site of old grit bin, Connegar Leys/Buttmead green area (smaller of the two) and Northampton Road bus stop lay-by opposite Station Road.

It is also hoped that the Canal and River Trust will provide a bin for the canal tunnel car park. SNC have indicated that they will empty the bins as part of their weekly round. Very useful information for our entry to the 2019 CPRE Litter Heroes competition.
