AFTERNOON GROUP

Membership remains constant with maximum capacity of twenty that meet in the Baptist Church Coffee House on a weekly basis during term time. The accommodation has access for the disabled so it is with pleasure that the Group has been able to support a wheelchair user who remains a regular and valuable attendee.

The **Annual Blisworth Art Show** held on the first May Bank holiday weekend 2018 continued to be popular although there were less exhibits. Over thirty artists representing 11 local Art Groups along with groups and independents from Northampton exhibited over 130 pieces of exciting art work. Footfall reached approx. 200 and success was measured by the number of works sold and with a donation made to the VH & PFA.

Both Groups made a significant contribution to the **Blisworth Canal Festival** by repeating their successful **'Picasso Pantry & Art Gallery'** in the Village Hall held in August 2018. Members were congratulated for their continued support and enthusiasm.

Informative workshops: Three were held that covered landscape watercolour painting, portraiture using a 'live' model where approaches & techniques with acrylics were explored and digital painting Hockney style. All three were delivered by invited Art Tutors during the course of the year.

Members from both Groups enjoyed a return trip to the Patchings Art & Craft Festival, Nottingham subsidised by the Art Group.

Experiences gained from just belonging to the Groups and participating in the activities ensures Members will look forward with confidence to another creative year.
