Notes from the Council.....

Contact Details for the Parish Council

Residents ask what is the way to contact the Council. The easiest ways are to email our Clerk blisworthparishcouncil@gmail.com or to use the "Contact Us" section on our website (www.parish.blisworthvillage.org). Otherwise, you can contact any Councillor who will help you.

Parish Council meetings returned to the Village Hall in May, the Government made it unlawful for Parish meetings to be held by remote online video conference, eg Zoom, based on a legal interpretation of 'being present' at Parish Council meetings. Our Council has selected the Village Hall as a safe and suitable location for the return of their face-to-face meetings, normally held on the first Monday of each month. Early indications are that the meetings are more productive with better understanding of what is discussed and agreed. There is space in the Village Hall for residents to attend in a Covid compliant manner by just showing up rather than having to use a computer with possibly poor connections. We hope this will extend transparency in local democracy and make it easier for residents to ask questions in the public sessions, just like we did for many years before our lockdowns. We have vacancies for three Councillors.

Keeping the Footways and Highways Clear

The Parish Council would like to remind residents to keep their hedges etc., maintained where they affect the public highway and footpaths. Residents concerned about overhanging hedges affecting public footpaths etc, should report the matter via the Northamptonshire FixmyStreet website (https://fixmystreet.northamptonshire.gov.uk). When reported West Northants Council (WNC) will contact the householder to maintain the overgrowth and, if there is no response, they can fix the problem themselves and charge the householder for the work.

Allotment Parking

There is an ongoing issue of illegal parking in the allotment parking areas that are for allotment users only. The Council will be providing a flyer advising people not to park in these areas and we would appreciate if you can help remind people not to park there unless they are allotment holders.

Special Grant from the Northampton Gateway Community Liaison Group

Blisworth Parish Council has an opportunity for a grant from the developers, SEGRO, of the Northampton Gateway warehouses and rail terminal, payable via West Northants Council. It is payable in 2 parts (now and approximately 3 years later on occupation of the first warehouse). Five local Parish Councils are eligible for the same payments that will be judged by the Council Spending Board - Blisworth,

Roade, Milton Malsor, Collingtree and Grange Park.

We are seeking feedback from residents about the key issues and ideas that comply with one or more of the following purposes:

- 1. carry out physical improvements to the public realm;
- 2. enhance nature conservation interest;
- 3. improve the physical environment of the villages within the areas of the Parishes.

Bring or Bag

The PC would like to thank the team that have provided the Bring or Bag facilities in the village bus stop adjacent to the Royal Oak. I am sure many villagers have valued and appreciated this facility and the organisers are looking for a party to undertake the safe and effective running of this facility on behalf of the village from October. If anyone is interested in taking this on, I am sure that this will be valued by the community. Please contact our Parish Clerk.

Highways Safety Issues

We continue to lobby all relevant organisations about the continued blight of traffic through our village. You may have seen the additional safety signage, reminding residents and road users that its 30 mph, that has been provided by the Highways team. This is a continued focus for the PC despite these Highways issues being managed by WNC. We would encourage residents to continue to report issues to the PC about speed, lorries, dangerous driving and accidents so we can continue to gather evidence in support of our case to improve the road safety in the village. Pot holes and highway defects should be reported to FixmyStreet website.

Planning

The Station Road house development application and appeal, WNC has declined the appeal from the developers of the proposed development of approximately 30 dwellings.

Play Area

The Council are preparing improvements to the Play Area, including a new bench that will be installed soon. other items are being repaired or improved.

The Pharisees got together, one of them, an expert in the law, tested Jesus with this question: "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law? Jesus replied: Love the Lord your God with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the greatest commandment. And the second is like it: love your neighbour as yourself."

Matthew 22 vv 34-40, taken from the NIV edition.

What about "The Ten Commandments"? Well, this reply of Jesus neatly shows that if we truly love God and love our neighbour, we will automatically obey all ten. We will not dishonour or abuse others, cheat or steal, but will take every opportunity to serve others and stand up for what is right.

At the time of writing, we are witnessing unprecedented floods and fires in Germany and other countries. Once, insurance companies called such events "acts of God". Although this term is not now used, acts of God are still found wherever there is disaster and suffering. Rescuers still crawl into collapsed buildings, risking life if there is any chance of a survivor. Folk give shelter to destitute families. Thousands give money, food and clothing. In all such acts, from greatest to least, God is at work. As the saying goes, "God has no hands but our hands". Let us use them. Let us not look only to our own finite and inadequate capacity, but instead reach for the resources of heaven.

Sadly we have witnessed the other side of the coin in the appalling abuse of young footballers by those who reject any sense of kindness, compassion or rightness. These are not acts of God – these are acts of pure evil.

Although many covid restrictions are to be legally lifted, in the church we will not immediately reverse all that we have put in place to safeguard everyone's wellbeing. We will follow advice from our Bishops and go ahead with caution, to ensure that progress, once attained, will hopefully never have to be reversed.

Over the last few weeks we have settled into a regular rota, as follows. There are services in St. John's in Blisworth at 11am on the first, second and fourth Sundays. On those days there will also be a 9.30 service at one of the other Benefice churches, on third Sundays there will be a 9.30am at Milton Malsor and an 11am at Grafton Regis. On a fifth Sunday there will be a single 10am Benefice service: on August 29th, this will be at Alderton. One weekly service will be available on zoom, and on Wednesdays at 9.30am there is a Celtic themed service on zoom. Please contact the Rector if you would like a link for any of these.

We continue to pray for all still affected by the virus, for countries where the situation remains bleak, and for those working tirelessly to overcome the pandemic.


