#### Facebook

# **Traffic Issues Update**

Northants Police installed traffic monitoring devices across the village in response to concerns raised around traffic speed and volume through the village. We continue to press the West Northamptonshire Council on this matter particular in light of proposed developments in the Towcester area and south of Northampton which continue to put further traffic pressure on the village.

Our July Round and About newsletter, issue 140 included an update on the Northampton Gateway Community Grant funding opportunities for traffic issues. If you missed this issue and have any feedback or ideas for how we use the Grant, you can still contact our Clerk by email.

### **Community Grants**

A new Covid Support Fund will provide WNC District Councillors with £2,500 each to allocate to community and voluntary groups that are in need of support. The fund is still open and will help effectively allocate money to Parishes to make a positive impact on the areas we represent, helping us to empower local residents to be active in their communities' recovery from COVID-19. Please make your requests known so we can help progress the grant opportunities.

## **New Mobile Speed Indicator Device**

The Parish Council has now purchased an additional Speed Indicator Device, and the plan is that it will, initially, be installed in Stoke Road. The device will be moved between Stoke Road, High Street and Courteenhall Road. It will be positioned towards the village boundary unlike the current VAS (Vehicle Approach Speed) devices on Stoke Road and Courteenhall Road, it records vehicle speeds as well.

# Carriageway Near the Village Boundary on Stoke Road The carriageway near the Blisworth Tunnel entrance and car park has deteriorated over recent years, partly because

car park has deteriorated over recent years, partly because of the volume and weight of traffic using our village routes. The immediate result is 3T weight limit signs close to the location of carriageway cracking, with advance warning signs at the junction of Knock Lane and at the High St.

The new weight limit has significantly reduced the number of heavy vehicles using the weak road but not removed them all, though continued use is illegal. If you have valid photographs of heavy vehicles breaking the law in the limit area, they can be passed to Police. Highways and Police do not willingly investigate without photographic evidence.

#### **Grit Bins**

The grit bins across the village have been replenished for winter. The bins are provided for the benefit of residents moving on public roads and footways during cold weather. Of course, the grit should not be stolen for use on private property, driveways or paths because it could cause bigger problems for more people out on public roads etc.

# **Play Area Improvements**

Repairs have now been carried out in the Eastfield play area and a new bench is to be installed shortly. New equipment will be installed in the coming months, primarily as a result of a National Lottery grant that the Parish Council has obtained, this has been awarded to improve and provide new equipment for the play area to provide safe play for children under the age of 12. Anyone who has feedback or ideas on the type of equipment also contact the PC.

# **Gigaclear Installations**

The PC's Facebook page has a copy of a letter received from the contractors that shows a schedule of works including planned road closures. The works are ongoing during the first half of 2022 and we have raised our concerns following resident's feedback to ensure that the contractors and Highways complete the works properly.

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee and Green Canopy National initiatives are underway to encourage local community participation during the Jubilee (2 to 5 June) and the Green Canopy, planting as many trees as possible during the year. It is open for all community groups to suggest ideas and to organise events, from parades, street parties, beacons, picnics, music events, big lunch, tea

dance, best decorated street, to a scarecrow festival.

Blisworth Village Stores, Post Office, Shops and Pub Please continue to support our wonderful local facilities. They provide a valuable amenity and service to our village and continue to need our support during uncertain times.

#### Blisworth Parish Church

"He counts the number of the stars. He gives names to all of them" Psalm 147 v4

"Lift your eyes and look to the heavens: who created all these? He who brings out the starry host one by one, and calls them each by name." Isaiah 40 V26

The guiding star that showed the way to the stable in Bethlehem when Jesus was born is such a well known part of the Christmas story. From the account of creation in Genesis ("He also made the stars" ch 1 v16), throughout the Old Testament, stars are mentioned, and even from those ancient times, constellations are called by names familiar to us today, The Bear, the Pleiades, Orion. Dark frosty winter nights give us the best chance of viewing the glory of God's creation in the sky.

There are 18 Dark Sky Reserves in the UK, but in most places our view of the night sky is attenuated by modernity's artificial light pollution, so we observe only a fraction of the glory that is actually there all the time. I believe that in the same way, humanity's openness to God is attenuated, or dulled, by the pressures and attractions of modern life. But if we will let go for a while of all that demands our attention, all that we find so important to us, we will be freed to experience the wonder of God's presence, in the same way that finding a place away from light pollution can reveal the splendour of the heavens.

We were thankful to be able to celebrate Christmas again in church, first with a Christingle service well attended by families, who formed a ring of candles in a darkened church, and later the Christmas communion. Now we are planning Easter services, full details of which, for St. john's and for the Grand Union Benefice, will be available soon.

Meanwhile there is a service every Sunday at 11 am, often preceded by the Benefice bell ringers. Having said that, they would dearly love to welcome more ringers, either new to the craft, or possibly with past experience. If you would be interested, just contact one of the ringers, or one of the wardens who will put you in touch.

We are well aware that the pandemic is still not over, and we pray for all who are unwell, those trying to negotiate current regulations, and all still suffering from the effects of the pandemic and all that we have gone through in the past two years.


