

Notes from the Council.....

Many residents will have seen the application to build a distribution centre on the site of the old abattoir and nursery on Northampton Road (Application no: WNS/2022/1134/MAO). The Parish Council have discussed this proposal in great depth and we have grave concerns around the negative impact this will have on our amazing village. As such we plan to most strongly object to this application on behalf of our residents, but we need you to add your views to show the depth of feeling on this matter.



These plans will bring approximately 17 HGV movements through the village every HOUR! In addition to the extra traffic from the staff using the centre. Let's not delude ourselves, the ONLY access to this development is through the village or from the direction of Milton Malsor.

If like me, you are wondering how these plans are even being considered, given that the A43 By-pass was built because Blisworth was deemed unsuitable for HGV traffic, please voice your concerns at <u>https://snc.planning-register.co.uk/</u><u>Planning/Comment/WNS/2022/1134/MAO</u>

Planning Application Reference No: WNS/2022/1134/MAO for Land to the west Northampton Road Blisworth Northants Towcester NN7 3DW.



Urgent: Developers are allowed to change the conditions of their original proposal once planning permission has been granted and residents cannot object.

Please consider adding to any objection that should this application be granted, that it is with the strict proviso that developers will not be allowed to seek an amendment to the planning application to include the use of HGVs as part of this distribution centre in the future.

Below are the main points that have persuaded Blisworth Parish Council to submit an objection:

1. This is a significant change in use for the site with development of a much larger scale, that will severely impact the well-being and safety of village residents and will not provide the promised facilities for small local businesses.

2. Blisworth roads are unsuitable for and cannot accommodate an estimated additional 247 HGV journeys a day to access the major roads. We are a conservation area with narrow roads that are already overly congested and, as has been accepted already, unsuitable for this type of traffic.

3. The routes proposed for this traffic to access major roads run past the primary school on two sides and cross a number of junctions that are unsuited to large vehicles. Also the main route down Northampton Road does not have adequate footpaths to provide safety to pedestrians, particularly where this meets the rail bridge. No account has been taken of the increased safety risk this represents.

It is important that you do not simply copy and paste the same objection as this will simply be counted as one objection. You need to use your own words to be HEARD.

Remember Blisworth Parish Council is but one voice and your silence is license for the developers to do as they please (see Cllr Karen Cooper's helpful guide overleaf).

The Deadline is 5th August for any comments or objections.

Step-by-step guide to register your comments / support / objections to Planning Applications on WNC's web site

<u>www.westnorthants.gov.uk</u> takes you to the front page of WNC's website. Scroll down to 'Council Services' and click on 'Planning and building control'. Click on 'view and comment on a planning application'.

Click on 'South Northamptonshire', this takes you to 'search the online register', the first heading gives you the opportunity to click on the link to see full details on how to use this service. Scroll half way down the page to 'reference number' and 'keyword search'.

If you know the reference number of the planning application you wish to comment on type it here, if you don't know it, use 'keyword search' and type 'Blisworth' and click 'search' at the bottom of the page. You then have all the planning applications, appeals and building control lists for Blisworth.

Click on the relevant planning application,

WNS/2022/1134/MAO Land to the west Northampton Road Blisworth Northants Towcester NN7 3DW this takes you to the full details of the planning application. Click on the blue box 'comment on this application' and enter your details, your name, email address and home address. Then select your type of comment in the box 'comment, support, objection' and type your comments in the comment box. Following this you can 'add a file' should you wish to.

Remember to read the 'privacy policy and terms and conditions of use' before submitting your form and click the 'I agree to the terms box'. Finally click the 'submit' box at the bottom.

On submitting your comments / support / objections you will receive an automated email acknowledgement.
