### Notes from the Council.....



Blisworth Parish Council, on behalf of the village offers its sincere condolences to the Royal Family on the announcement of the sad death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II at the age of 96 years. Thank you to Cllr Hawkins for arranging the flowers on behalf of the Parish Council.

There was standing room only at the recent public meeting to discuss SEGRO's application to vary the conditions of the Development Consent Order (DCO). All the attendees agreed that we should object to this proposed amendment.

Thank you to all the delivery volunteers. They distributed the flyers about the SEGRO amendment around the village in record time, ensuring that all the residents were informed about this latest development.

The Council did meet with SEGRO representatives to get a balanced view of their reasons for the amendment. It was an informative meeting and the Council acknowledges their effort to engage on this issue. However the Parish Council still had serious reservations about the application. We have sent an objection as requested by the residents. A copy of the objection is available on the website.

There seems to be so many planning applications that threaten the villagers' way of life but it is a way of life that is worth fighting for and yet again the residents of Blisworth have rallied together to fight for their community, rather than just sitting back and moaning from the comfort of the sofa.

We continue to add pressure to Highways for road improvements but we need residents to add their voice and experience. Every time someone submits an offence, the Police record it and this helps them to build up a picture of issues in the local area.



Gigaclear have finally completed work in Blisworth – At last! The date for the Gigaclear Community Walk has been postponed to **Tuesday**, **18th October 2022**. This is to allow residents time to contact the parish council with any concerns. Any issues with the roads and/or pavements after their works or any of the equipment left by Gigaclear, please contact the clerk so that the parish councillors can raise your concerns with Gigaclear before they sign off their works.

Simon Bunker has sadly resigned from the Parish Council. I would like to thank him on behalf of Blisworth Parish Council for all his hard work especially for sorting out the lighting contract which was a huge achievement and for securing lower electricity costs for the village lights until 2025! I would also like to welcome Councillor Bill Root who has recently joined the Parish Council and is already working hard to support the village.

We should have 12 councillors but we only have 8 at the moment and we really need more councillors to help to move projects forward. We need to get enthusiastic residents to help with looking after the green spaces around the village, we need passionate residents who like to challenge the developers and we need young (or youngish as long as you know how to do it) social-media whiz-kids to update our social media. It's a great team, we need your help and it's a positive point to add to your C.V.

#### The Baptist Ministry in Blisworth continues

On Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> September 2022, an Induction Service took place at Blisworth Baptist Church to welcome and acknowledge the appointment of Lee Hillyard as the new Pastor. The post had become available due to the retirement of Keith Barker, at Easter, following eleven years' dedicated service. Lee had served as Assistant Pastor for more than four years, and as Acting Pastor since Keith's retirement. In July, the church members elected Lee to be the new Pastor.

The Service of Induction was led by Rev. Carol Murray, representing the Central Baptist Association, and she also gave the sermon for the day with a powerful message for all those in attendance. All of the Church Leaders were involved during the service, along with the previous two pastors, Keith Barker and Ted Ashworth. Keith led the time of worship and gave the Induction Prayer, whilst Ted read from Proverbs 3 and gave a short account of why this Bible chapter was so important to us all.

The chosen date for the service coincidentally had significant links with the Church's rich history. On 15<sup>th</sup> September 1825, the first service had taken place in the newly built red brick meeting place (the chapel). The early Baptists had previously worshiped in each others' homes and for thirty-six years in a farmer's barn, rented from the Duke of Grafton.

A few weeks later, on 1<sup>st</sup> November 1825, the Church was officially established with eleven new members, who had been transferred from nearby Roade Baptist Church. On 6<sup>th</sup> September 1826, George Foskett was ordained and inducted as the first Pastor at Blisworth. In September 2022, Lee Hillyard became the twenty-seventh officially appointed and inducted Pastor.

The Lord's work in Blisworth and the local community continues, and together we look forward to celebrating the two hundredth anniversary in 2025.
